

PROCLAMATION

KIDNEY AWARENESS DAY March 9, 2023

WHEREAS, 37 million adults in the United States are estimated to have chronic kidney disease and millions of others are at high risk of developing the condition; and

WHEREAS, kidney disease is the tenth leading cause of death in the United States; and

WHEREAS, more than 19,300 Pennsylvanians are receiving dialysis because of kidney disease, and 6,012 Pennsylvanians are on the waiting list for kidney transplants because of their ailment; and

WHEREAS, groups at high risk of developing chronic kidney disease include those with diabetes, hypertension, heart disease, obesity, and a family history of kidney disease; and

WHEREAS, African-Americans, Hispanics, Pacific Islanders, Native Americans, and individuals over the age of sixty-five are at increased risk of developing chronic kidney disease; and

WHEREAS, early detection and treatment can often keep chronic kidney disease from getting worse and prevent the need for dialysis or a transplant; and

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Department of Health and the Renal Disease Advisory Committee are committed to increasing education and awareness of the causes of kidney disease.

THEREFORE, I, Josh Shapiro, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby proclaim March 9, 2023 to be KIDNEY AWARENESS DAY. I encourage all Pennsylvanians to recognize the importance of kidney health, chronic kidney disease prevention and awareness.
