



PA VFC Patient Eligibility Screening Record

A record of all children 18 years of age or younger who receive immunizations must be kept in the health care provider’s office for three years or longer depending on state law. The record may be completed by the parent, guardian, individual of record or the health care provider. VFC eligibility screening and documentation of eligibility status must take place with each immunization visit to ensure the child’s eligibility status has not changed. While verification of responses is not required, it is necessary to retain this or a similar record for each child receiving vaccine. Providers using a similar form (paper-based or electronic) must capture all reporting elements included in this form.

5. To determine if a child (0 through 18 years of age) is eligible to receive federal vaccine through the VFC Program, enter the date and mark the appropriate eligibility category. If Column A-D is marked, the child is eligible for VFC vaccine. If column E, F, or G is marked, the child is not eligible for VFC vaccine.

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*Underinsured includes children whose health insurance does not cover vaccines or only covers certain vaccines. Children are only eligible for vaccines that are not covered by their insurance. Underinsured children are eligible to receive VFC vaccine only through a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC), Rural Health Clinic (RHC), or an approved deputized provider.

** Other underinsured include children who do not have health insurance but are not eligible to receive VFC vaccine because the provider or facility is not a FQHC, RHC, or a deputized provider.

***Children enrolled in state Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) are considered insured and are not eligible for VFC vaccines.
