

Highberger Building, c. 1872

The Highberger Building was home to the 1st National Bank from 1872 until 1903. It later became a jewelry store and now is the office of Dr. Highberger.

2

LaMantia Building, c. 1829

This Federal style brick building has housed family businesses that have been active in Blairsville since 1888. Ravaila's restaurant currently occupies the storefront. LaMantia Produce, the oldest continuously run family store in Pennsylvania, maintains a business in the rear of the building.

Blairsville Diamond

Beginning in 1818, lots were sold from this location -the original center of town- and a town square was formed. In the early 1900's, a bandstand – surrounded by a cupola and two cannon barrels of Civil War vintage – was erected on the site. Later, a monument to President McKinley was erected. In the 1930s, the statue and the bandstand were removed and the cannon barrels were relocated to the Veterans Circle in the Blairsville Cemetery; the location of the monument is unknown. In 1999, the community raised funds to build the bandstand that exists today.

James Campbell House


One of the oldest buildings in Blairsville, the – then named – William Brown House was built in the Italianate Vernacular style. The House was renamed as the James Campbell House. It is currently occupied by Founders Gallery & Gifts. It is one of the oldest buildings in Blairsville.

St. Peter's Episcopal Church and Rectory

The Church was chartered in 1828 with the congregation first meeting in a log house in the vicinity of the present church property. The church building was completed by 1830. The parish house, built in Queen Anne style during the 1890s, is now used as a social hall. Both buildings are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Ernest Company Store

This site was once the establishment of the Ernest Company Store. In 1903, the Company Store was a warehouse constructed by R & P Coal Company for better quality shoes, clothing, and household items. A fire gutted the store forcing it to close on September 29, 1972. Since then, the lot has remained vacant.

Ernest Doctor's Office

Although today it is a privately owned residence, the property was formerly the location of the Ernest Doctor's Office, which housed a full-time doctor for the local miners and their families. When the mine was open, it was common for the doctor to make house calls at the patients' convenience.

Ernest Mine Office

Mine Office is where the general business of the Ernest Mine took place. Due to insufficient funds, the mines finally closed in 1965.

The Ernest Company Church


In 1933, the Ernest Company Church, formally known as Mt. Zion Baptist Church, had a predominantly African American Christian congregation. The church building slowly deteriorated and, by 1980, was vacated, leaving only the existing foundation. Years later, the Ernest Bible Church purchased the property and transformed it into what is today the church parking lot.

Ernest Elementary School

The empty lot was once the site of the Ernest Public School, which was attended by immigrant children of over 13 different nationalities. The school closed in 1964 and was demolished shortly after due to its poor conditions. At the time, all students were moved to Rayne Elementary, a neighboring school, to continue their education.

Baptist Church

The Church was built in 1902 and remodeled in 1936 to install a new basement dining hall, a modern kitchen and paint to the original tin ceiling. Although the Church updated many of its features, it still houses a 1902 Steinway piano that was purchased at the St Louis World's Fair in 1903 by Senator J.O.Clark and was then transported to Glen Campbell by train.

2

Union Church (now the United Methodist Church)

The Union Church was the first church to ever be built in Glen Campbell. The Church was once a place for various religious sects to meet and worship. In 1894, the Church became primarily a Presbyterian congregation. It was not until 1967 that it merged with United Methodist Christians and renamed the establishment what is today known as the United Methodist Church.

Gazebo at Borough Park

The Glen Campbell gazebo was placed in the center of town at the Borough Park in 2006. The gazebo has various seating areas and small tables which are perfect for resting and relaxing. The park trees provide shade from the sun and a horseshoe pit serves as an additional area for recreational activities.

Post Office (Original National Bank)


The lot of the Glen Campbell Post Office was the location of the town's National Bank, which opened in 1899. In 1930, a fire destroyed the National Bank, though the vault could not be moved and, thus, remains. The current building was erected around the vault, which remains to this day and is visible through the large front windows of the Post Office.

5

Loyal Order of the Moose

The Loyal Order of the Moose – Lodge #443 built the current building in 1911. The Moose operated for many years in town until the local chapter closed. In the 1980's, it was remodeled into an office, Jos-Win Farms. Today, the building is owned by geologist, Dr. Joseph Clark, whose family has lived in Glen Campbell for many years.

Floodway Park

This recreational park was created after the flood of 1977 destroyed many of the residential homes and business, including a hotel, an ice house, and a pizza parlor, located in the flood plane. Up creek from Floodway Park, a gristmill provided Homer City with its first Post Office name: Phillips Mills.

2

Homer City Historic Society

Located within a refurbished red caboose, the Homer Center Historic Society houses early records of the area. The caboose is real; however, it never ran on the Pennsylvania Railroad.

3

Hoodlebug Trail

Nicknamed for the self-propelled passenger coach that ran on the Pennsylvania Railroad line until 1940, The Hoodlebug trail follows the abandoned Indiana Branch of the railroad. Built in the 1850s, the Indiana branch was the first railroad constructed in the county and followed a Native American trail know as the Catawba Path.

Homer City Cemetery

A small cemetery donated to the town by the Weir family. Squire Weir was the first squire, similar to a mayor, of the town in the late 1800s. The last burial was in the mid 1930s.

5

Former Prairie State Incubator Company

Founded in 1887, The Prairie State Incubator Company produced incubators used to raise chicks from eggs. By 1913 the incubator factory was reported to be the largest in the world. An incubator from the Prairie State Incubator Company is on display at the historic society caboose.

Jimmy Stewart Statue - This larger-than-life statue of Stewart was erected on May 20, 1983 on Stewart's 75th birthday. In 1995, The Jimmy Stewart Museum, a museum dedicated to his life and career, opened in the Community Building next to this site. A replica of his statue, rendered in green fiberglass, resides in the museum.

2

Yellow Brick Road - This century-old road was built with the recognizable yellow "Clymer Bricks." For decades, much of Indiana Borough was paved with these locally manufactured bricks and the remnants still exist underneath the pavement. Only a few alleyways exist today, such as this section of Clymer Avenue, from which there is a stereoscope view into the history of downtown Indiana.

Home of Governor John S. Fisher - This Queen Anne-style Victorian mansion with ballroom and sleeping tower was built by the Edward Rowe family in 1902. John S. Fisher lived here at the time of his election as Pennsylvania's 29th Governor (1927-1931). Governor Fisher died in 1940 and is buried in the Greenwood Cemetery on Oakland Avenue in Indiana.

Old Courthouse Building - Built in 1870, this Mansard-style roof and large gold leafed cupola with a four-faced clock tower is perhaps the most iconic structure in the county. The building was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in October 1974. The final court session was on Veterans Day 1970. Now the building houses the administrative offices for First Commonwealth Financial; the gold cupola is a logo for the company.



Memorial Park & Doughboy Statue - Memorial Park, the smallest of the county parks, was once a church cemetery (with many graves still remaining in the park). During the Civil War, the site served as a hiding place for travelers of the Underground Railroad. The park's Doughboy statue was erected in 1925 by a group of citizens led by Alex Stewart, father of the actor James Stewart.

Grace United Methodist Church - Grace United Methodist Church (est. 1831) was dedicated in this location July 17, 1931. This New England-style, Colonial building with coordinating appointments was fashioned after the Old North Church in Boston, MA. Its bell tolls every 15 minutes through town.

Oak Tree

Oak trees are flowering plants that produce fruit. The fruit of an oak tree is a nut called an acorn. Oak wood is very hard and strong. It was used to make the planks for Viking Ships during the 9th and 10th centuries!



Fern

The fern is a very old plant species found in fossils dating back 360 million years! Scientists believe these plants have changed very little for most of that time, what they refer to as evolutionary stasis.



Hemlock Tree

This tree is an evergreen plant because it has leaves all year long. Sometimes the leaves of a hemlock tree are called “needles”. Hemlock trees produce cones that release seeds. After releasing the seeds, the cones fall to the ground!



Maple Tree


Maple trees produce a fruit called samaras which contain seeds. Samaras spin as they fall and look like helicopter propellers! The Sugar Maple is tapped for sap. Collected sap is boiled to produce maple syrup.



Ground Cedar (“Crows Foot” or “Club moss”)

This plant is found close to the ground and carpets the forest floor in shaded areas. Ground cedar is normally only about 4” in height. It was once sold as a traditional Christmas greenery!

Old WDAD Radio Transmitter

The former 250-Watt tower stood in this approximate location. WDAD put the tower and station into play on November 4, 1945. The radio transmitter was taken out of commission in the mid 60's.

S&T Bank Arena

This is the site of the former Super 422 Drive-In that opened July 10, 1953. In 1995, the arena opened as a privately owned sports facility. Thanks to grants provided by Governor Rendell's administration, White Township purchased the Arena in 2005. The building includes an NHL-size ice surface and a 16,000 sq. ft. turf for many local programs like ice skating/hockey, soccer, lacrosse, baseball, softball, whiffle ball, track and field, fitness and others. In 2006, the indoor facility was named S&T Bank Arena when the Bank became the official sponsor.

Bioswale

Stormwater in this facility is directed to underground pipes by planted open channels. This is a type of stormwater management system called bioswales, a green alternative to an all pipe system. Bioswales improve water quality by allowing small amounts of rain to be absorbed into the ground and filtering the large storm flows helping to improve overall stream health by reducing pollutants and sediment.

Keystone Rehabilitation Baseball Stadium


To host baseball games, this stadium was constructed by Township staff from 2002 to 2004. White Township purchased approximately 700 seats from Three Rivers Stadium, prior to its demolition in 2001. Thousands of Pittsburgh Pirates and Steelers fans cheered from these seats.

White Township Recreation Complex

This is the site of a former golf driving range. White Township purchased fifty acres in 1995 and constructed the recreational facilities over the next ten years. The complex hosts many activities including soccer, tennis, baseball, basketball, picnic and community events, walking, and geo caching.
