<u>Valley Youth House Emergency Runaway and Homeless Shelter</u>	<p>The shelter offers up to 15 days of emergency housing for youth ages 12 to 18. Shelter, clothing, food and general emergency needs are provided. Intensive individual and family counseling and other case management services are available during the youth's stay. Youth may refer themselves, or can be referred by parents, teachers, police, social workers and other agencies.
