<p>Decontamination/Clothing Removal</p>	<p>(1 of 2) Think you were exposed to sarin? Remove clothing, wash entire body with soap/water & call 911 for immediate medical care #EventHashtag</p> <p>(2 of 2) Any exposed clothing that has to be pulled over the head should be cut off the body instead of pulled over the head #EventHashtag</p> <p>When helping someone exposed to sarin remove their clothing as quickly as possible & avoid touching contaminated areas #EventHashtag</p> <p>If exposed to sarin: as quickly as possible, wash any sarin from your skin with large amounts of soap and water #EventHashtag</p> <p>If your eyes are burning or your vision is blurred, rinse your eyes with plain water for 10 to 15 minutes #EventHashtag</p> <p>If exposed to sarin & you wear contacts: remove them after washing hands & put them with contaminated clothing. Don't re-use #EventHashtag</p>	<p>Think you were exposed to sarin? Remove your clothing, wash your entire body with soap/water, & call 911 for immediate medical care. <p>Pets</p>	<p>Never leave your animal behind if you have to leave your home. Have a plan for them too bit.ly/NTRISR #EventHashtag</p> <p>Bringing a pet or service animal to a shelter? Bring leash/vet records/license & week's supply of food/water/meds #EventHashtag</p> <p>Also bring a current photo of you with your pets to the shelter to help others identify them in case you get separated #EventHashtag</p>	<p>Remember to never leave your animal behind if you have to leave your home and make sure to include your pets in your emergency plan.
