



The Pennsylvania Department of Health's (DOH) Choose Safe Places for Early Care and Education (CSPECE) program helps to ensure child care facilities are located in safe places, so that children and staff are not exposed to harmful chemicals from the surrounding environment.

To help identify potential environmental hazards at or nearby your facility, please refer to the checklist below. Child care providers who take the CSPECE survey (https://sst.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV\_6YDlvP6Aw9SyH1Y) will receive guidance from DOH on ways to prevent or reduce environmental exposures, if any potential harmful exposures are identified.
