Schuylkill Haven Route

- Island Park The Park is a recreation venue which is home to a pavilion, multipurpose sports fields, walking/bike trail, boat launch and future amphitheater.
- Schuylkill River Water Trail The Schuylkill River begins at its headwaters in the mountains near the tiny coal-region town of Tuscarora, PA and flows southeasterly for 137 miles through Schuylkill, Berks, Montgomery, Chester, and Philadelphia Counties on its way to its confluence with the Delaware River. A public access point to the Schuylkill River can be found along the Irish Flats in Island Park.
- Reading and Northern Railroad The Schuylkill Haven station is a former railroad station originally built by the Reading Railroad and currently occupied by the Reading and Northern Railroad as an office building. The passenger train offers seasonal opportunities to experience rail transportation from Schuylkill Haven. Trips include Fall Foliage excursions and rides with Santa Claus.
- Schuylkill Haven Free Public Library The public library offers Internet access for research, job searches, faxing, copying, and Inter-library loan services. Various children and adult programs are offered throughout the year.
- **Schuylkill Haven Area Historical Society** The Historical Society is dedicated to preserving the history of Schuylkill Haven, Pennsylvania and vicinity. It is open on Saturdays: 9:00am-12:00pm.
- **Walk In Art Center** The Walk In Art Center houses 16 individual creative studios for working artists, the Folk Art Gallery, the Main Gallery, rotating exhibits, activities for young and young at heart, diverse events, and a fully-equipped classroom.
- **Bubeck Park** Bubeck Park features Stoyer's Dam, a performance stage, and three pavilions equipped with electricity. It also has several charcoal grills, a gazebo, war memorial, small playground, and handicap accessible bathrooms.
