1	Jacob Chalfin, Chair, introduced himself and did role call of Committee members an DOH staff, and reviewed the agenda.	
2	Review and approve the meeting minutes from the SCRAC meeting on April 21, 2022.	
	 Dr. Cooper moved to accept the meeting minutes of April 21,2022. Dr. Caldera 	
	second. No discussion. No opposition or abstentions. The motion passed	
	unanimously.	
3	Vote on 2023 Priorities	
	 As a review it was discussed that the current research priorities remain the same to support the timely distribution of the 2023 RFA the current research priorities are as follows: 	
	 Pharmacologic, biologic, medical device, brain stimulus, and rehabilitative approaches and techniques. 	
	 Preference will be given to those projects and techniques that seek to change the nature and course of the injury. 	
	 To ensure funded research addresses the gap in translation of discovery to human study and proposal, further preference will be given to research that is strategically translational or translatable relative to aims and outcomes. 	
	 Finally, further preference will be given to research strategies that represent either potential or existing collaboration with industry, whether in the development and trial of biologics, pharmacologics, device, or novel therapeutic rehabilitative treatments in combination with these developments. 	
	 Dr. Cooper made a motion to accept. Dr. Abramoff second. No discussion. No opposition or abstentions. The motion passed unanimously. 	
	 2024 Priorities to be discussed at the January 2023 Meeting. 	



4 Tier Funding Levels for 2023 RFA

- The funds that are released annually for this grant amount to a total of one million. As
 you recall last year the funding amount was two million to account for the prior year
 of funding as well. This year we have caught up and are back down to the annual one
 million dollar amount.
- As such, the tier levels are being adjusted as discussed in the prior meeting to the follow levels:

o Tier 1: \$100,000

o Tier 2: \$150,000

o Tier 3: \$ 250,000

- Mr. Charlton made a motion to approve tier funding levels for 2023 RFA. Dr. Cooper Second. No discussion. No opposition or abstentions. The motion passed unanimously.
- Dr. Cooper inquired how to increase funding in the future. William Cramer
 recommended observing and planning over the next 6 months. The one million
 dollars was set in the statute, and would require it going back through legislature to
 change the statute. Research would need to demonstrate success and progress.
 Recommended waiting for the second year of the new administration.
- 5 | End of serive term for SCRAC Members
 - In the Summer of 2019, SOH Levine appointed the members of SCRAC.
 - Statute states members are to be appointed for a term of two years by the Secretary of Health.
 - o Terms for all members are coming to an end.
 - New applications will be sent out within the next month to all existing board members. They may re-apply if they wish to continue to sit on the board.
 - Accomplishments and Recap of the Past Two Years
 - Establishing research priorities for the betterment of people living with spinal cord injuries
 - o Developed a process for SCRAC Final Review
 - Established funding tiers for research projects
 - Developed language for the RFA
 - Galen Graham will email applications to Committee members. Members will need to
 fill out the application and email it to Galen Graham. Program will forward
 applications to the Secretary of Health for decision as was done in the past.
 - Dr. Boninger resigned and his role will need to be filled. Dr. Winer has not been attending SCRAC Meetings and will need his role filled.
 - *Mr. Chalfin* requested recommendations for replacements. *Dr. Abramoff* knows neurosurgeons who may be interested in applying for a position on the Committee.
 - Members who would like to make nominations for new Committee members are to email the information to Galen Graham.



6 Open Discussion

- Status Update on 2021 Spinal Cord RFA67-127 selected Proposals:
 - Proposals are currently being reviewed by HRO Staff.
 - Proposals are set to tentatively go to the Office of Procurement the end of November 2022. Proposals are not held and sent in batch, each application is sent as HRO Staff completes their review.
 - Timeline is dependent on how quickly the Principal Investigator's respond to HRO Staff's requests for changes. Once the proposals make it through the HRO approval process they must still go through the review by the Office of Procurement, and the signature process in Offices outside of the Health Research Office.
 - William Cramer will reach out to Legal Staff to inquire about what information we can release at this time.
 - Pamela Brown stated once fully executed documents are received HRO will post for payment. It will take up to 45 days for Comptroller to release funds from the date the invoice is posted for payment.
- Status Update on 2022 Spinal Cord RFA67-153
 - Tentative timeline is to have HRO complete their portion of the review by the end of November. There is no timeline for offices outside of HRO to complete their reviews of RFA67-153.
 - PeerNet will not be used for the submission of the 2022 Spinal Cord RFA67-153 applications due to the challenges faced with 2021 Spinal Cord RFA67-127 applications.
