

HOW TO TELL THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN COVID-19, LYME DISEASE, & WEST NILE VIRUS

COVID-19 is of great concern and may be hard to identify because other diseases can begin with similar symptoms. Even though they are entirely different illnesses, Lyme Disease and West Nile Virus infection may also make you feel like you have the Flu.

Bites from infected ticks and mosquitoes are common in PA from March through October but can occur year-round. Keep in mind that the treatment is different for all three diseases and may be urgent.

- Facial Paralysis
- Short Term

- Vison Loss
