The PA Asthma Control Program builds a more equitable future for asthma.

In September 2020, the Pennsylvania (PA) Asthma Control Program (ACP) was awarded a four-year cooperative agreement (NUE1EH001394) from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This agreement funds the implementation and coordination of the EXHALE technical package. Year 2 activities occurred during September 2021 to August 2022. Established in 2006, the PA ACP is the collective work and interventions of many partners at the state and community levels.
