The second dose of HepB may be given either at the 1 month or 2 month visit.

Two doses of influenza (flu) vaccine given at least four weeks apart are recommended for children aged 6 months through 8 years of age who are getting a flu vaccine for the first time and for some other children in this age group.

Two doses of HepA vaccine are needed for lasting protection. The first dose of HepA vaccine should be given between 12 months and 21 months of age. The second dose should be given 6 to 18 months later.

Three doses of the hepatitis B shot are recommended for children.
