All Saints Church

All Saints Church was erected in 1908. The architecture is Gothic Mission style. The statue of St. Francis de Sales and other artifacts are placed around the grounds of the church and former school.

Fort Mason Museum

The Fort Mason Museum, the former home and medical office of Dr. Edgar Wells, features rooms depicting life in the early 1900's. The building was purchased by the Historical Society in 1992. Guided tours are available weekends during the summer and by request.

Masontown Municipal Building

The borough's municipal building, at the corner of Main Street and Cross Avenue, was originally the site of the Hotel Altman, which was rebuilt as the Fort Mason Hotel after a fire in 1909. Opposite it was the LeRoy Hotel (formerly Sterling House) and also the site of underground tunnels used for restocking supplies.

Masontown United Methodist Church

Masontown United Methodist Church was the first church in Masontown. Originally located on the south side of West Church Avenue, it was damaged in a violent storm in 1820 and reconstructed in 1892 at its current location.
