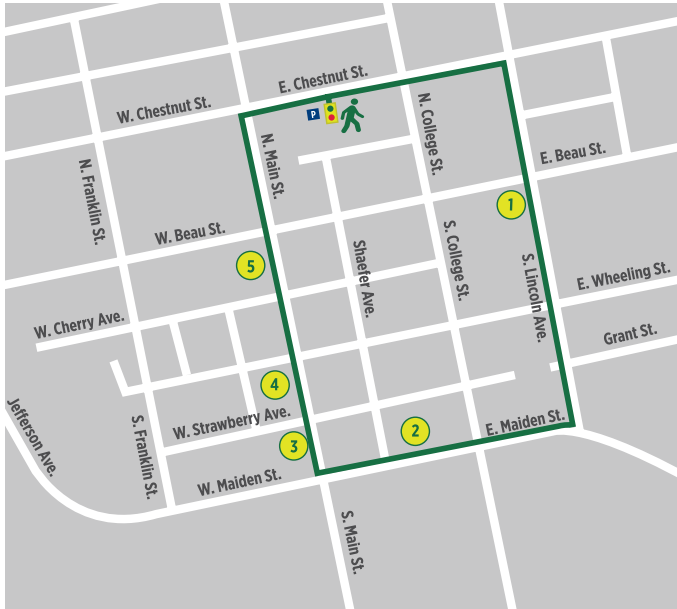

Washington & Jefferson College

Located at the corner of Beau and Lincoln Streets, on the Washington & Jefferson College campus, are the statues of George Washington and Thomas Jefferson, by sculptor Alan Cottrill.

Dr. Francis J. LeMoyne House

The LeMoyne House, built in 1812, was the home of Dr. Francis LeMoyne and served as a safe hiding place along the Underground Railroad. Dr. Lemoyne was a leading abolitionist and founder of the Abolition Society in 1824.

Bradford House Museum

The Bradford House, built in 1788, was the home of Whiskey Rebellion leader, David Bradford, a noted attorney and businessman. From 1791-1794, he aided the area farmers in rebellion against the federal excise tax on whiskey and became a wanted man for his actions.

Community Pavilion

The Pavilion is home to the Farmers Market, community events and a mosaic mural designed by Laura J. McLaughlin and created by students from Washington High School.

Washington County Courthouse

Built in 1900 in the beaux arts style and is renowned for its grandeur, the Washington County Courthouse has been referred to as the "People's Palace."
