

Downtown Kennett Square Route

- Kennett Library
 Located in the heart of the Kennett Square Historic District, the Kennett Library was granted charter on January 30, 1895. The library was named for Bayard Taylor, a prominent Kennett Square-born poet and writer. The Kennett Library is part of the Chester County Public Library System and is open to all county residents.
- Magnolia Place
 Magnolia Place is a new development that links the downtown Historic District to the western-most end of the borough. The Magnolia Place community will feature residential housing, retail and office space, as well as a walking trail and open space.
- The Samuel Pennock House
 The Samuel Pennock House, also known as Cypress Lawn, was built in 1864 by Samuel Pennock. Pennock was the founder of the American Road Machine Company and invented the snow plow among other road machines. His home reflects the Victorian architecture of the Kennett Historic District
- Kennett Square Borough Hall
 Kennett Square Borough Hall is housed within the Hicks-Schmaltz House, which was built in 1899 in the Queen Anne style.
 Incorporated in 1859, Kennett Square has a vibrant past including its role in the Revolutionary War, the abolition movement, and agricultural innovations reflected in today's dynamic mushroom industry.
- Kennett Area YMCA
 The Kennett Branch of the YMCA of Greater Brandywine is a community and fitness center that promotes youth development, healthy living, and social responsibility. Amenities including a swimming pool, basketball court, weight room, indoor track, and a wellness center are available for members.
