

- **Loller Academy Borough Hall** Built in 1811, Loller Academy was originally an educational institution. In the 1950's, the residents of Hatboro voted to restore the building and convert it into borough offices and a town hall.
- Miller Meadow Park Miller Meadow Park is an open field with various wildflowers and community gardens. There are plans for Miller Meadow to be transformed into a community park featuring hard surface trails, benches and a gazebo. These transformations are set to be complete by 2021.
- Old Mill Inn Built in 1724 as a grist mill and restored in 2016, this 4-story fieldstone building sits along Pennypack Creek. Its history dates back to the Revolutionary War when General George Washington used the grain from the mill to feed his troops. Today, the Mill hosts a variety of special events and corporate outings.
- **Lehman Church** Built in 1836, the Lehman Methodist Church was the first church to be built in Hatboro. The Church was built by Deborah and Joseph Lehman in memory of their son.
- Union Library Created in 1755, the Union Library Company of Hatboro is the third oldest library in Pennsylvania and the second oldest library still operating under its original charter. In 1980, it was added to the National Register of Historic Places.
- Hatboro Federal Savings Open in 1941, Hatboro Federal Savings has been supporting the community for seven decades. Its first mortgage was issued on April 17, 1941 in the amount of \$4,500 for a home purchased in Hatboro.
- Hatboro Train Station Opened in 1871, it was originally the Reading Railroad's New Hope Branch. The station serves as a rail station for SEPTA's Warminster line, which runs to Center City Philadelphia.
- **8** Hatboro Police Department Originally the site of Borough Hall offices, this building is home to the Hatboro Police Department.
