
Braddock's Walkway to Health Route

Braddock's Walkway to Health Route

- Braddock Farms, Grow Pittsburgh
 - Braddock Farms is the largest production farm and Braddock's single source of fresh produce.
- Mon Valley Works, Edgar Thompson Plant
 This is the first of Andrew Carnegie's steel mills in the Pittsburgh area. Located in North Braddock, the mill has been active since 1872 and continues to contribute a large percentage of overall all steel production in the U.S.
- Future Home of Braddock Civic Plaza
 The formal ground breaking of Braddock Civic Plaza is scheduled to be held in late summer 2017.
- Braddock Free Store
 This store receives donated and surplus goods and then distributes them to neighbors in need.
- Brew Gentleman

 After converting an old electrical supply store into a brewery and taproom, Brew Gentlemen was opened by two Carnegie Mellon University graduates in 2014. The hop-forward flavored brews have become a local favorite, attracting Pittsburghers from all over the city to Braddock Ave.
- Braddock Borough Building
 Braddock Borough was unified on June 8, 1867. The town's industrial economy began in 1873, when Andrew Carnegie built the Edgar Thomson Steel Works on the historic site of Braddock's Field. The current Borough Building was built in 1960.
- This the first Carnegie Library
 This the first Carnegie Library in the United States. As such, the library was named a National Historic Landmark in 2012, following its listing on the National Register of Historic Places in 1973 and is on the Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation's List of Historic Landmarks.
