Honor Roll/Memorial

The Honor Roll/Memorial was put in place by the American Legion and displays the names of veterans/members of the community who fought in World War II. In addition, there are the Eternal Flame and Granite Stones dedicated to veterans of all wars.

Jerome Park

The Park, once a maple grove, has been turned into a playground. Jerome Park is the home of the Summer Feeding Program and hosts other community events.

Parkhurst Memorial Presbyterian Church

The lot on which the Church stands was a cemetery that has not been used since 1889. The historic Presbyterian Church, built in 1889, is a two-story, brick church structure in a Late Victorian Romanesque style. It features a central tower at the entrance with belfry and tall steeple. The Church was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2012.

Marigold Manor

This stately Queen Anne Victorian home was built by the C.L. Pattison family in 1886. In the center of town, with its striking architecture and surround iron fence, the home provides an elegant landmark.

Finelli Estate

The house, on the Finelli Estate, was built in 1849. The most distinct characteristic of the property is the small village of four small houses out back. Another distinction of the property is its extraordinary decorations during special holidays.

Coates Heritage House/Museum

This structure was built before 1875 and was owned by the Coates family until the 1970's when it became the home of the Elkland Library. In the mid 1990's, it was purchased by a resident and turned into a Museum. The Museum is open to the public to view its many historic artifacts.
