

## Mansfield Route

- Mansfield Free Public Library
  - The Mansfield Free Public Library was built in 1912 of vanilla brick. A Carnegie library, it still occupies the original structure.
- Soldiers' Orphans School
  Built in 1870, by Fordyce Allen, the Soldiers' Orphans School became the Hotel Allen in 1889 when the orphans moved to Harford, PA. It burned in 1904. A memorial monument is now located at the place where the Orphan School stood.
- The Telephone Building
  Built in 1948, as the telephone exchange, the building has been a video store, a donut shop, the Hungry Monkey restaurant and now houses the Chamber of Commerce.
- Smythe Park
  Smythe Park was purchased by the borough in 1879 from the estate of Dr. Smythe. It was home to the Mansfield Fair. It is now part of public property and hosts a variety of community events.

The First Night Football Memorial honors the 1892 Mansfield Fair's night football game under electric lights, the first in the world.

The Railroad Historical Marker represents where the Corning & Blossburg Railroad passed through Mansfield.

World War One Memorial
This World War One Memorial on the side of the Allen Block commemorates local people who served in the military during World War I. It has been refurbished several times by the American Legion.
