

Claysburg's Past & Present Walk Route

- Little League Field
 - Claysburg Little League is a non-profit organization led by volunteers to provide basic baseball/softball knowledge and instruction to children ages 5-12 that live in the Claysburg-Kimmel School District. The league is focused on education of the sport and teaching sportsmanship to these children.
- Claysburg Public Library

 Built in 1926, the Claysburg Library building originally included the location of many businesses, including a two-lane bowling alley on the first floor. The second floor of the Library had been a dance hall that hosted Friday night dances for the African American community and Saturday night dances for the Caucasian community.
- Shenanigans
 Located along Bedford Street, Shenanigans was previously occupied by Kreutzberger's Bar and Restaurant. The General Refractories Company store, Eagle Mercantile, and Clover Farm Store were located next to Kreutzberger's. In the 1920's, the red brick building across from Shenanigans was the first kindergarten in the area specifically for the children of the managers employed by General Refractories. Located behind Shenanigans is a garage that is the former location of the Claysburg Bottling Works where fruit flavored soft drinks were made.
- McCabe Warehouse
 The McCabe Warehouse area had once been farmland with only a few homes. In 1913, it became the location of the Standard Refractories Company and in 1922 the General Refractories Claysburg Plant moved in manufacturing silica bricks. Over the years, the McCabe Warehouse parking lot has been the site for many recreational activities including a baseball grandstand and tennis courts, with numerous carnivals and many 4th of July celebrations over the years. A 100-year old Ginko tree is located next to the McCabe office building, which loses all its leaves in a day each year around October 20.
- Claysburg Post Office
 Dedicated in 1960, the Claysburg Post Office was the original location of the two-room Claysburg schoolhouse. The schoolhouse closed in 1918 when the new brick high school was built.
