

## Marienville Four Seasons Route



Construction on the school began in 1949 with completion of the first three rooms in 1950. In 1953, major construction included a gym, cafeteria and stage. Three more classrooms were added in 1958. In 1961, five classrooms, a library, a larger cafeteria, and dining room were added. The building presently houses pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade.

Northwest Bank

The bank opened for business in 1924. Through the years it changed names from Gold Standard (1924-1970), Warren National (1970-1982), and Marine Bank to PNC until Northwest purchased it in 1999. Northwest operates 162 offices with its headquarters in Warren, PA.

Marienville Train Station

Pittsburgh Bradford and Buffalo River Road laid narrow gauge rails through Marienville in 1881. Rail lines connected Parker to Kane. The original train station burned down in 1902 and was rebuilt two years later. In 1911, the tracks were converted to standard gauge rails. Jenks Township purchased the train station to be part of the Marienville Four Seasons Trail Project.

Marienville Library

The Marienville Area Library began in 1969 in the Kelly Hotel. It moved to its present location in 1982. The library services eastern county residents and allows seasonal visitors to access public computers and WiFI. The library offers programs for all ages.

Marienville Area Civic Association

Marienville Area Civic Association (MACA) was formed in 1964. The Association has built a log community building, a public swimming pool, playground, basketball courts, and a baseball field to be used for recreation.
