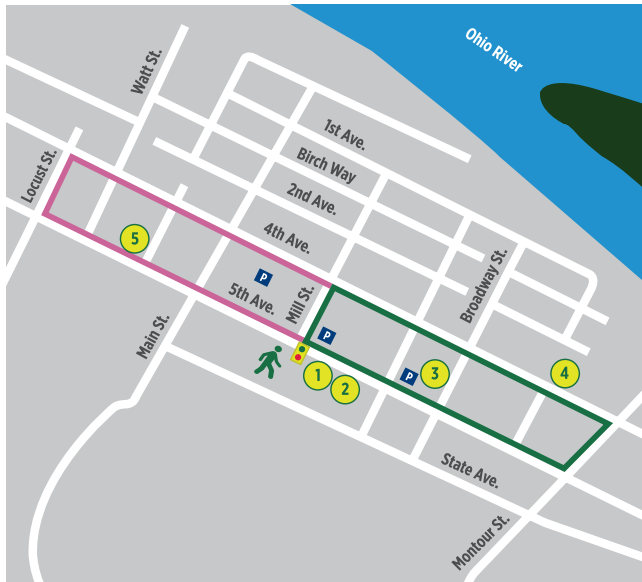


Coraopolis Borough Route

St. Joseph Roman Catholic Church

St. Joseph Parish is a part of the Diocese of Pittsburgh and was founded in 1889 by Rev. Michael Hughes. The original church was built in 1897 and located on Fourth Ave & Chestnut St, but was destroyed by a fire in 1941. The current location, built in 1925, has been the home of the parish ever since.

Coraopolis Borough Building

The new borough building, which is scheduled to finish construction in late spring, will house the police and fire departments, the water and sewer authority, and borough administrative offices.

Coraopolis National Guard Armory

The Coraopolis Armory was built in 1938, and currently serves as a recruiting center for the Army National Guard. It was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1991 and is home of the 28th Signal Battalion.
