1	Jacob Chalfin, Chair, introduced himself. Committee members,	
	and DOH staff introduced themselves. There were no individuals from the public in attendance. Jacob	
	Chalfin, reviewed Agenda.	
2	Alex Charlton moved to accept the meeting minutes of October 14, 2020. Dr. Cooper second. No	
	discussion. No opposition or abstentions. The motion passed unanimously.	
3	Update on 2020-2021 Request for Application (RFA)	
	Letters of Intent (LOI) were due on December 22, 2020.	
	<ul> <li>The vendor's Peer Review Panel is scheduled to review grant proposals on February 17, 2021.</li> <li>Dr. Fischer inquired regarding the number of applicants per tier. Keith Fickel stated that since the RFP is in the blackout period, normally it is not possible to disclose this information. He explained that the blackout period ensures that confidentiality and integrity is maintained and that there is no outside influence. He agreed to inquire with the Chief Counsel regarding making an exception, regarding disclosing the number of proposals that were submitted and to provide the Committee with a response within 24 hours.</li> <li>Jacob Chalfin informed Dr. Fischer and the Committee members that although there were proposals submitted, this did not necessarily translate to an equal number of applications, as</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>all who submitted LOIs did not submit a grant application.</li> <li>Jacob Chalfin suggested that reasons for the low application submission rate could possibly be due to COIVD, the short turnaround timeframe and due date during the holidays. Also, that there was not enough promotion of the grant.</li> <li>Unspent funds may be rolled over into the 2021-2022 grant year.</li> <li>Dr. Fischer suggested that knowing the Tiers where there were fewere submissions would help the Committee know what communities to outreach to in the future, in order to improve the number of submissions.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Jacob Chalfin asked how long after the Peer Review Panel completed it's work, would be before the Committee could review applications. Penny Harris suggested that it could be within a week.</li> </ul>

	a) Review of SCRAC Applications Procedural Overview	
	The SCRAC is still working through the language of its grant proposal review procedure.	
	<ul> <li>Jacob Chalfin inquired with the DOH whether the Committee could make recommendations to increase the amount of funding for a proposal that it deemed to be noble. Also, whether the Committee could decide not to fund a proposal. Penny Harris suggested that an award amount could be lowered and that it would be the Committee's decision regarding who would be funded and how much.</li> </ul>	
	• <i>Dr. Fischer</i> moved to approve the First Cycle of Procedures document. <i>Dr. Abramoff</i> second.
