1	Dr. Rachel Levine, Secretary of Health, was not present for the entire meeting. Sarah Boateng,
	Executive Deputy Secretary, chaired this meeting in Dr. Rachel Levine's place. Sarah Boateng,
	Executive Deputy Secretary, introduced herself. Committee members, Public attendees, and DOH staff
	introduced themselves. Attendees were made aware a stenographer was present for record keeping,
2	and to ensure minutes accurately reflect the actions and recommendations made by the Committee.  Dr. Rachel Levine provided an update on COVID-19.
	Statewide total of 95,000 Penssylvanians who have tested positive.
	6,900 deaths that have been attributed to COVID-19.
	All the important metrics, dashboard and tables are available on the PA DOH website.
	At the beginning of the pandemic there were a higher number of cases in people ages 19-49,
	before it spread to those over 65. We are once again seeing those types of increases.
	CDC and PA DOH have developed a lot of guidance's to ensure hospitals, LTCF's, businesses,
	residents, etc. have public health advice.
	COVID-19 may have impacted universities and research centers and that there are a lot of
	uncertainties. Therefore, any programmatic and funding related concerns should be directed
	to our Health Research Office.
3	Mr. Tombros moved to accept the meeting minutes of April 21, 2020. Dr. Masucci second. No
	discussion. No opposition or abstentions. The motion passed unanimously.
4	Executive Deputy Secretary Boateng provided a review of the CURE Program and updates.  CURE Funding and Alzheimer's RFA Update
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	<ul> <li>The State Fiscal Year 2019-2020 amount has been finalized as \$47,005,000.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The amount for the 2019-2020 CURE non-formula Alzheimer's Disease priority is \$11,288,807.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>As discussed in the last meeting, DOH has shared the Recommendation for Alzheimer_NF Grants Summary_HRAC document for the Committee's information.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The grant term per the Request for Application started June 1, 2020.</li> </ul>
	Biology of Aging RFA Update
	<ul> <li>The Biology of Aging RFA using SFY 2020-2021 funds is under review and scheduled to be submitted to Procurement by the beginning of August for contract and legal review before finalizing and posting to the Department of General Services website.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>As this time, our estimated timeline of posting the RFA for Biology of Aging is early October 2020 with a submission date of mid-December 2020. Due to the current COVID- 19 circumstances, we were not able to stay on track of our initial plan; however, these dates provide a realistic goal.</li> </ul>
	Formula and Non-formula priorities
	<ul> <li>During the January 2020 meeting, the decision was made to maintain the research priorities for formula funds for 2021-2022 the same as in prior years as clinical, health services, and/or biomedical research as defined by the Act.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>For the purpose of priority setting, the Committee recommended at the January 2020 meeting combining the two non-formula funding categories of clinical and health services research and other research for the 2021-2022 State Fiscal Year. At least 50 percent of the funds must be spent on clinical research and/or health services research.</li> </ul>
